
Answer Question 1.

Source A

Fig. 1.1 shows the number of people aged under 25 in selected countries. The data shows population changes in these countries between 1975 and 2015. The secondary data in the chart was gathered by the World Health Organisation (WHO). The WHO employs professional researchers to produce its statistics using census data from each country. The researchers rounded data up or down to the nearest million people.




