2 Read carefully the following opening to a historical novel. It is set during the Second World War, and the boy's town is about to be invaded. He is trying to find a place of safety for himself and his younger brother. He thinks the schoolmaster can help them.

How does the writer make this such a tense opening to the novel?

To help you answer this question, you might consider:

- how the writer portrays the town at daybreak
- how he conveys an atmosphere of growing tension
- how the writing makes the final two paragraphs dramatic.
