(c) Explain why many Muslims rejected western education in the nineteenth century. [7]

(d) Assess the significance of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan's work in improving the status of the Muslim community in the subcontinent in relation to the following:

- his 'Two-Nation' Theory
- his contribution to education
- changing relations with the British
